Monetary stability is the backbone of international trade and investment and the Euro is one of the world's most resilient major currencies. The Greek financial crisis of 2010 has triggered an intensive political and legal debate in Europe and beyond how to reform the European Monetary Union to secure the necessary economic and monetary discipline of its member states. This has lessons for all those interested in the legal, macroeconomic and political aspects of the international monetary system.

Professor Norbert Horn is Professor of Private Law, German and International Business and Banking Law, and Legal Philosophy, and Director (emeritus), Banking Law Institute, University of Cologne. He is an independent Arbitrator, Mediator, and Legal Counsel. Since 1998, he is also professor, Graduate Group in International Commercial Law, University of California, Davis, and since 1996, an honorary professor of China University of Political Science and Law. Professor Horn's areas of specialisation include German and International Contract Law, Banking and Financial Law, Companies and Joint Ventures, Commercial and Investment Arbitration, and Monetary Law.
